Enrichment Policy 2011-12

Statement:

The College is committed to offering students as broad an experience as possible within the financial constraints in which it operates.

Enrichment activities will be offered in a wide range of sports, centrally coordinated by a named member of staff.

Other activities will be offered through Faculty and Subject Areas, Tutorial and Cross College Teams and be coordinated by Faculty Leaders and Year Heads.

Students will also be offered the opportunity to offer activities which will be approved by the College Forum.

Purpose:

To add value to the students' main program of national qualifications, through breadth, depth and innovation.

Types of activity that will be supported

Activities which:

- Extend the most able, gifted and talented
- Engage employers with students
- Develop enterprise and leadership skills
- Engage students with professionals
- Place learning in a different context
- Develop independent learning
- Develop communication, language, team working and/or numerical skills
- Develop a sense of citizenship/community
- Promote a better understanding of health (physical and mental)
- Develop a better understanding of the positive contributions of diversity
- Prepare students for early adulthood
- Improve a sporting, practical or artistic performance

Student commitment

All students should have the opportunity, and be encouraged, to participate in Enrichment activities during their time at College.

This may be participation in a Curriculum trip or a discreet activity when they are not timetabled for their core programme.

Quality monitoring

The MIS team will monitor the Enrichment activity in the College, and report to SMT on the breadth and take up of experience on a half termly basis.

Faculty and Cross College Self Assessment Reports will include evaluation of the Enrichment activity in their areas annually.

Student views will be sought over which activities are most wanted and the impact of the activities measured through surveys and focus groups which will in turn inform SAR's.
